PERFORMANCE MONITORING AND REVIEW

Council is committed to reviewing the Kingston Planning Scheme at least once every three years to ensure that it is responsive to changing local circumstances and new land use opportunities/issues.

An ongoing program of performance monitoring will be developed to evaluate both the achievement of strategic policy directions and the operational effectiveness of the administration of the scheme.

A general performance monitoring program will include analysis of:

- Number of statutory applications received since gazettal of the scheme.
- Average time taken to process applications.
- Feedback from development industry on timeframes and costs associated with the applications processed under the new format scheme.
- Break down of decisions made since gazettal.
- Degree of compliance of applications with MSS and local policy objectives.
- Degree of VCAT support of the clarity of the MSS and Local Planning Policy Framework.

Monitoring of key components of the Kingston Planning Scheme which relate to the management of residential development will include:

- Mapping the distribution of new medium density housing development across the municipality.
- Continued identification of Residential Opportunity Sites as part of the Department of Sustainability and Environment's Monitoring Program.
- Reviewing of Census and Department of Sustainability and Environment data in order to assist with monitoring population profiles and future trends.
